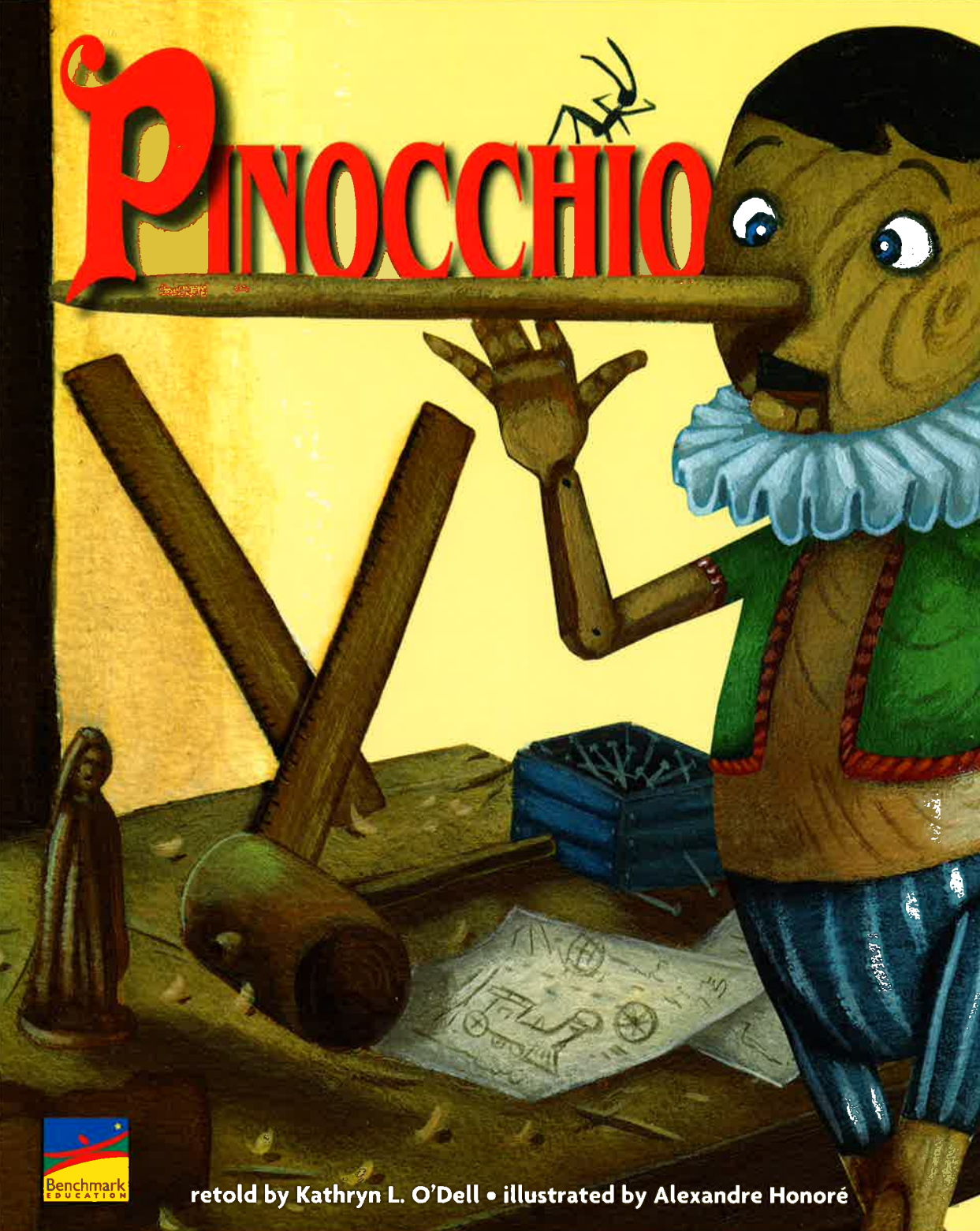


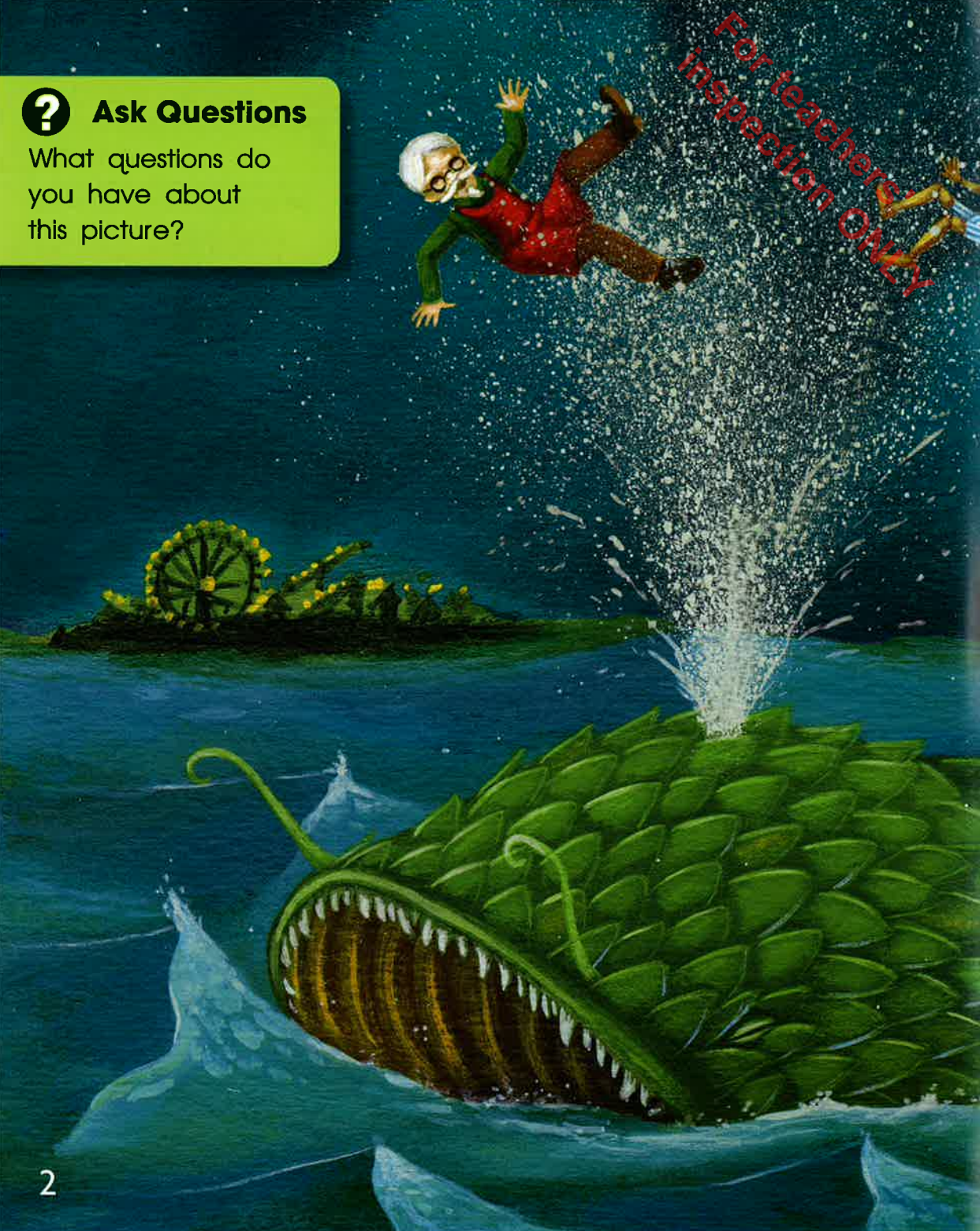

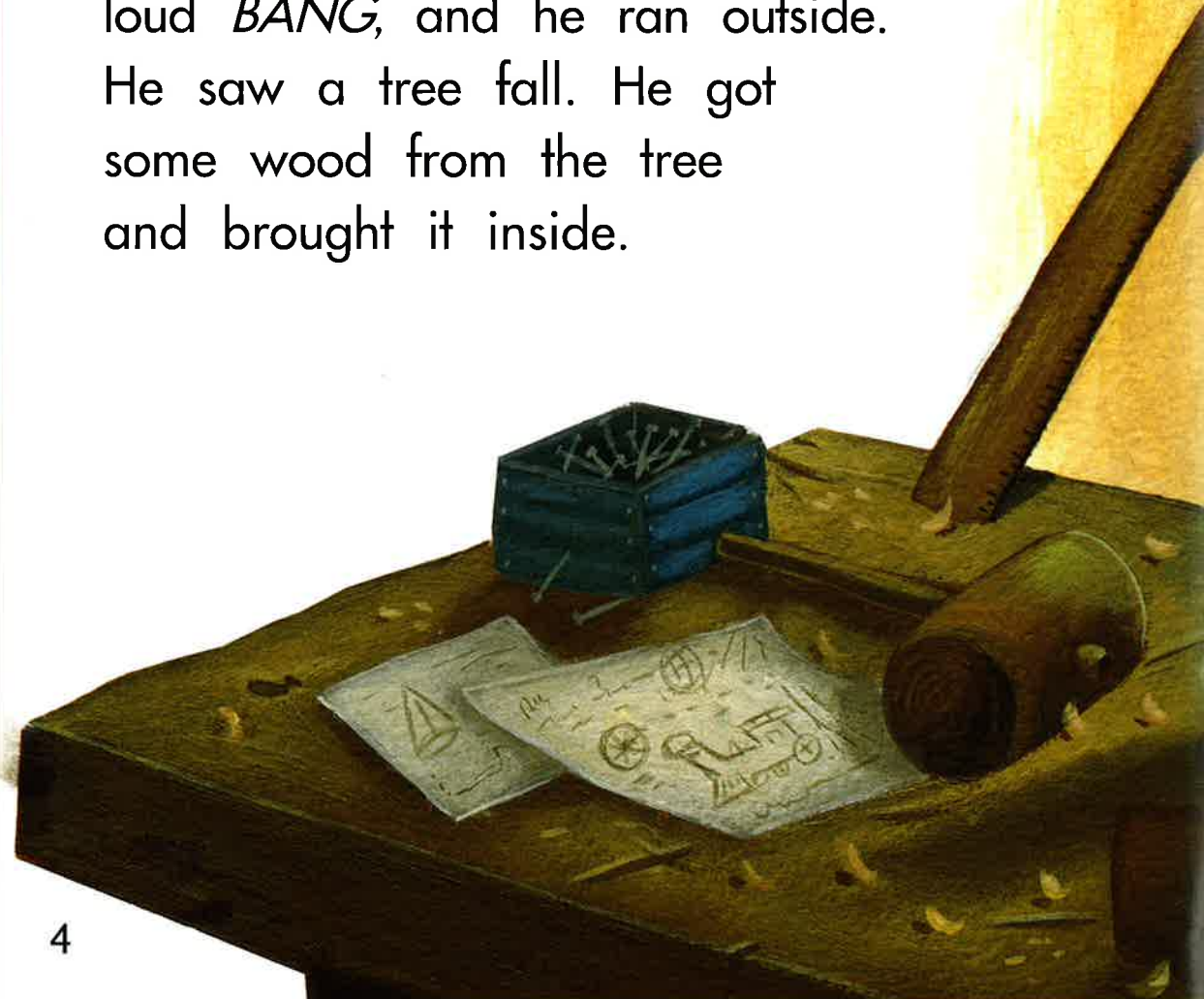

After he made the mouth, the puppet said, "Hello! I'm Pinocchio."



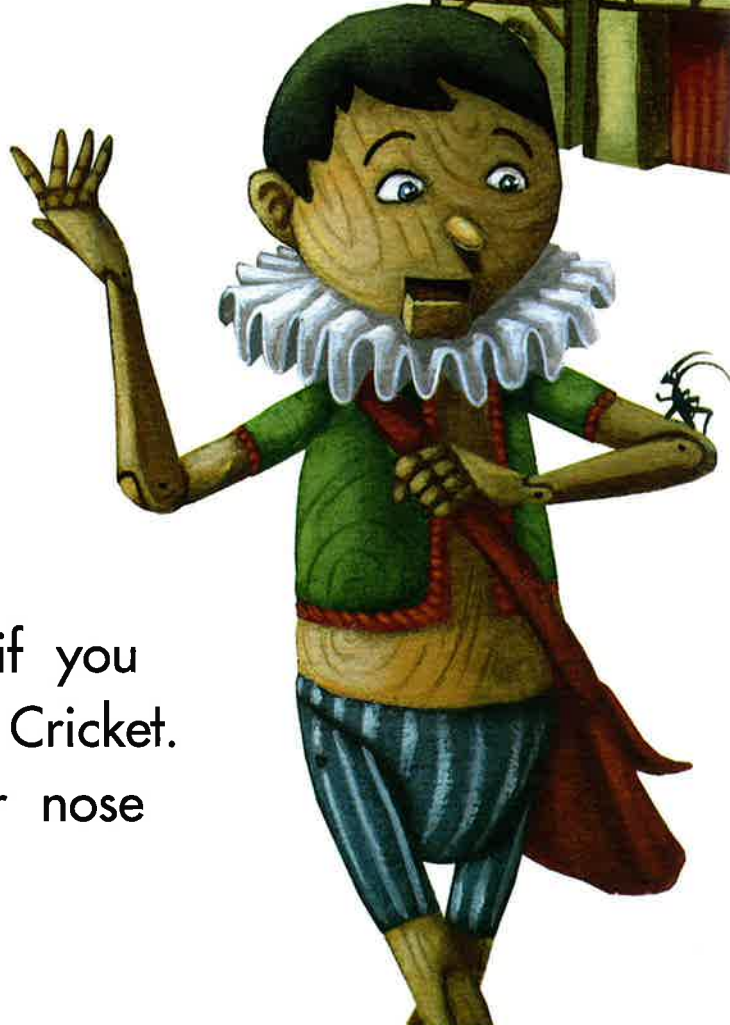


“You’re a real boy!” Geppetto said.
