

- Help remind them that understanding their place in the world helps them develop personal respect and respect for others.

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
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
How to Read This Book with Children

- 1 Read aloud the title. Explain what it means to be a global citizen.
- 2 Read aloud the book with children.
- Talk about who forms the global community.
- 4 Ask children to describe how they feel knowing that their decisions matter as part of a global community.
- After reading, use the Real-World Wrap-Up prompts to discuss the photograph.
- 6 Guide children to connect the story to their own experience of being a global citizen.


I'm a GLOBAL CITIZEN
