


Who was Johann Sebastian Bach?

Bach came from a very musical family. It is no surprise that he loved music. His father was a court musician in Eisenach, which is part of Germany today.

Other members of the Bach family worked there as musicians long before Johann Sebastian Bach was born in 1685.





Bach lost both his parents when he was just ten years old. He moved in with his older brother, Johann Christoph Bach, who taught him to play the organ. Playing the organ was a skill that helped Bach find jobs as he got older.

Like his younger brother, Johann Christoph Bach was a composer and organist.






Bach became the organist to the Duke of Arnstadt. At the Duke's court, there was a church with an organ.

Bach wrote many of his great organ works at this time.

He became very famous as an organist and was invited to play in other big churches and to give advice on how to build organs.

In 1714, the Duke made Bach his Concert Master, a job that paid more money. Bach had to write music for churches. But in 1717, he was given a job in the town of Köthen, where he would make even more money. The Duke was angry and did not want him to go, but Bach



In Köthen, Bach worked for Prince Leopold. The Prince was very musical and a wonderful man to work for. Bach was the Head of Music and was treated well.
