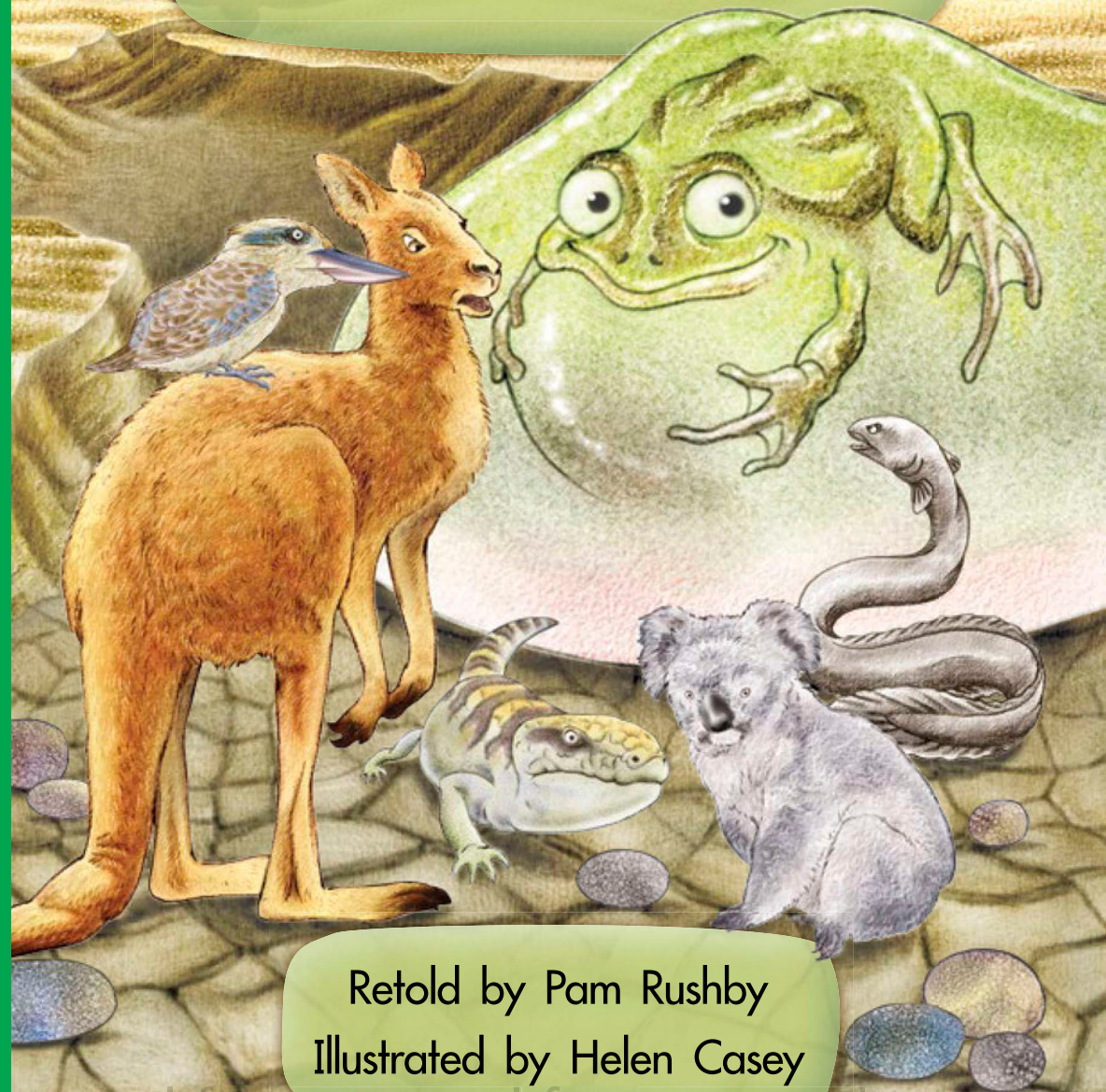

“I have an idea!” said Kookaburra.

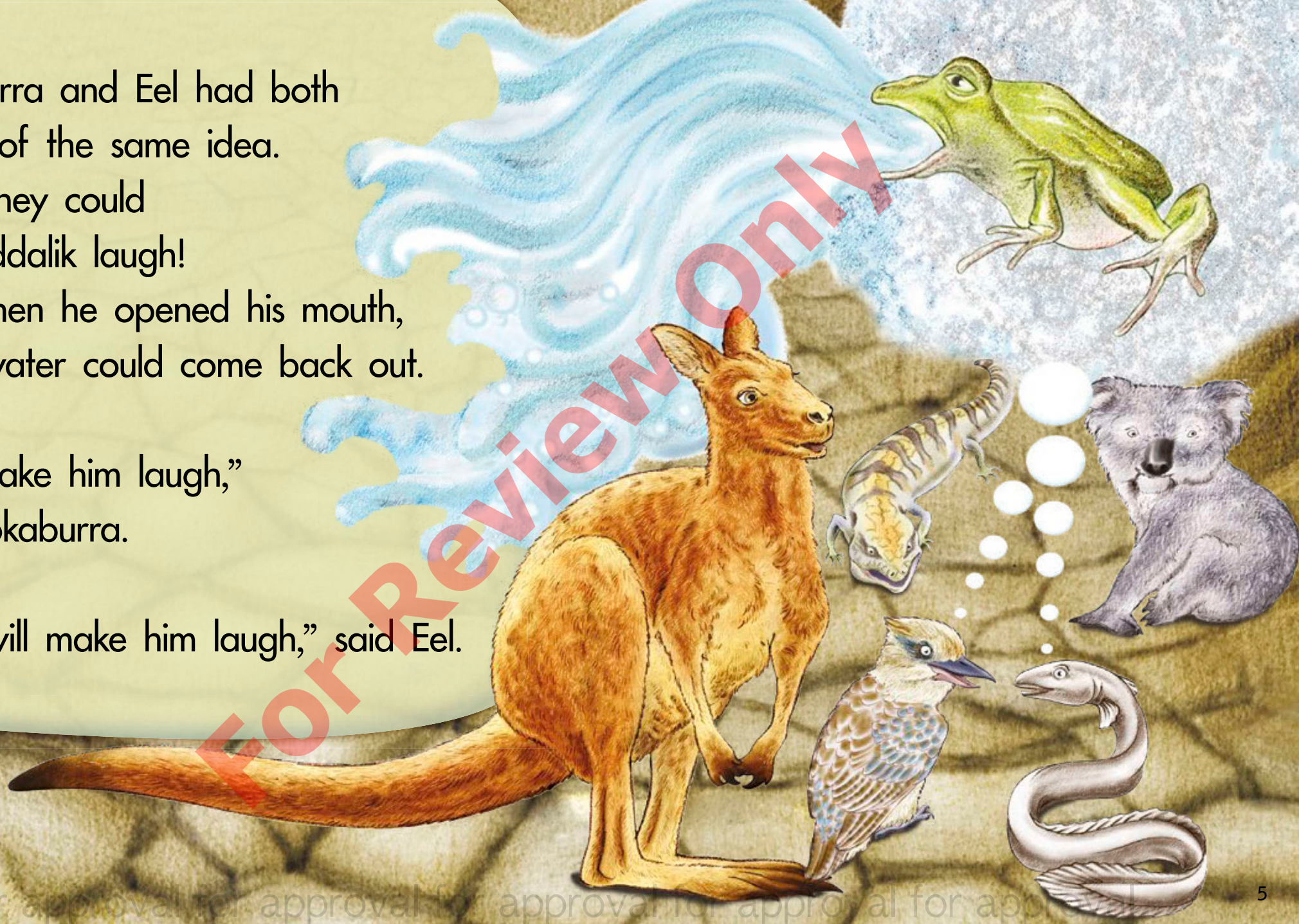
“So do I!” said Eel.
