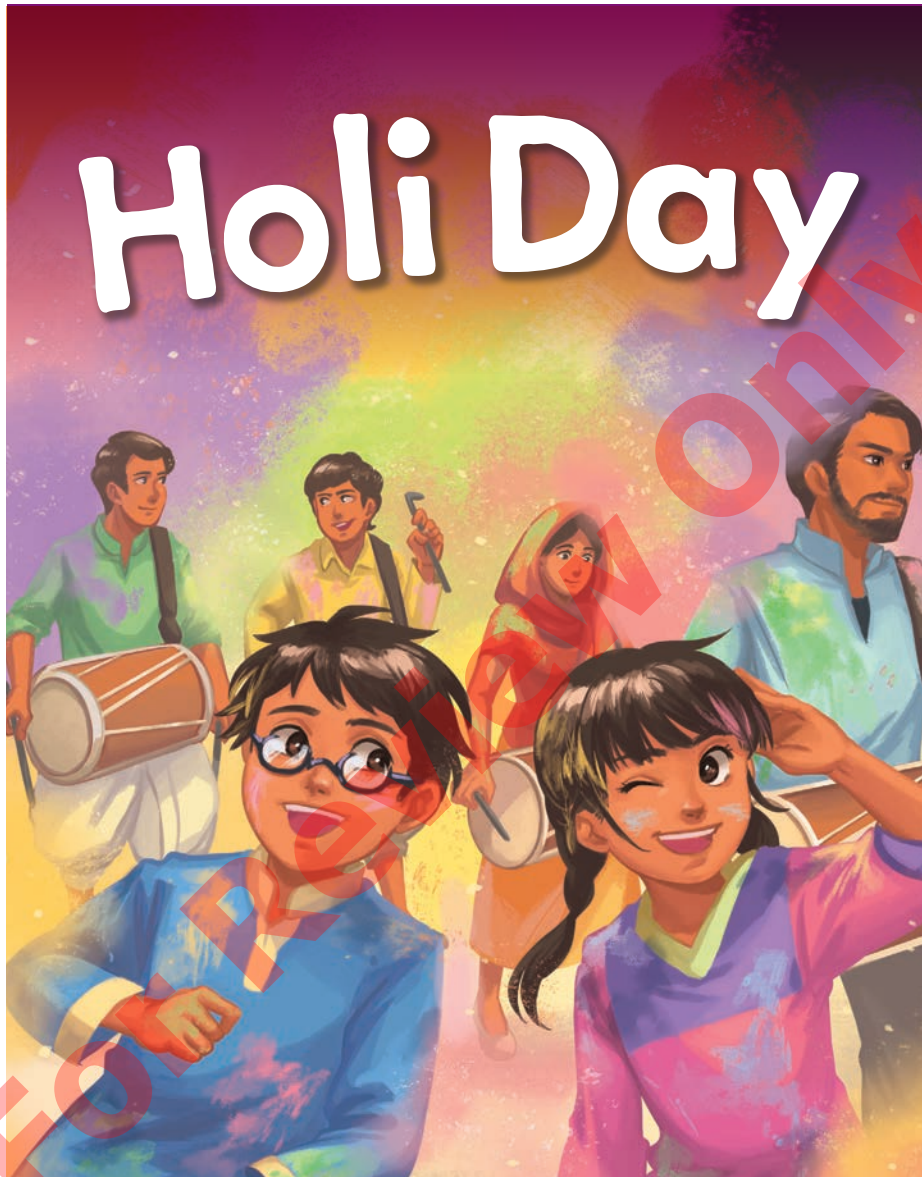


Holi Day
