Lia is dressed and ready for the parade.

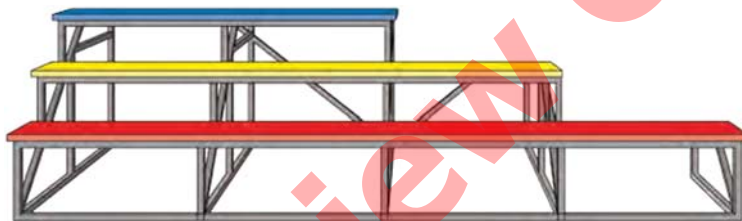
The parade goes through the city. It takes two hours for the **floats** to finish the **route**. Lia and her parents find seats on the **bleachers**.
