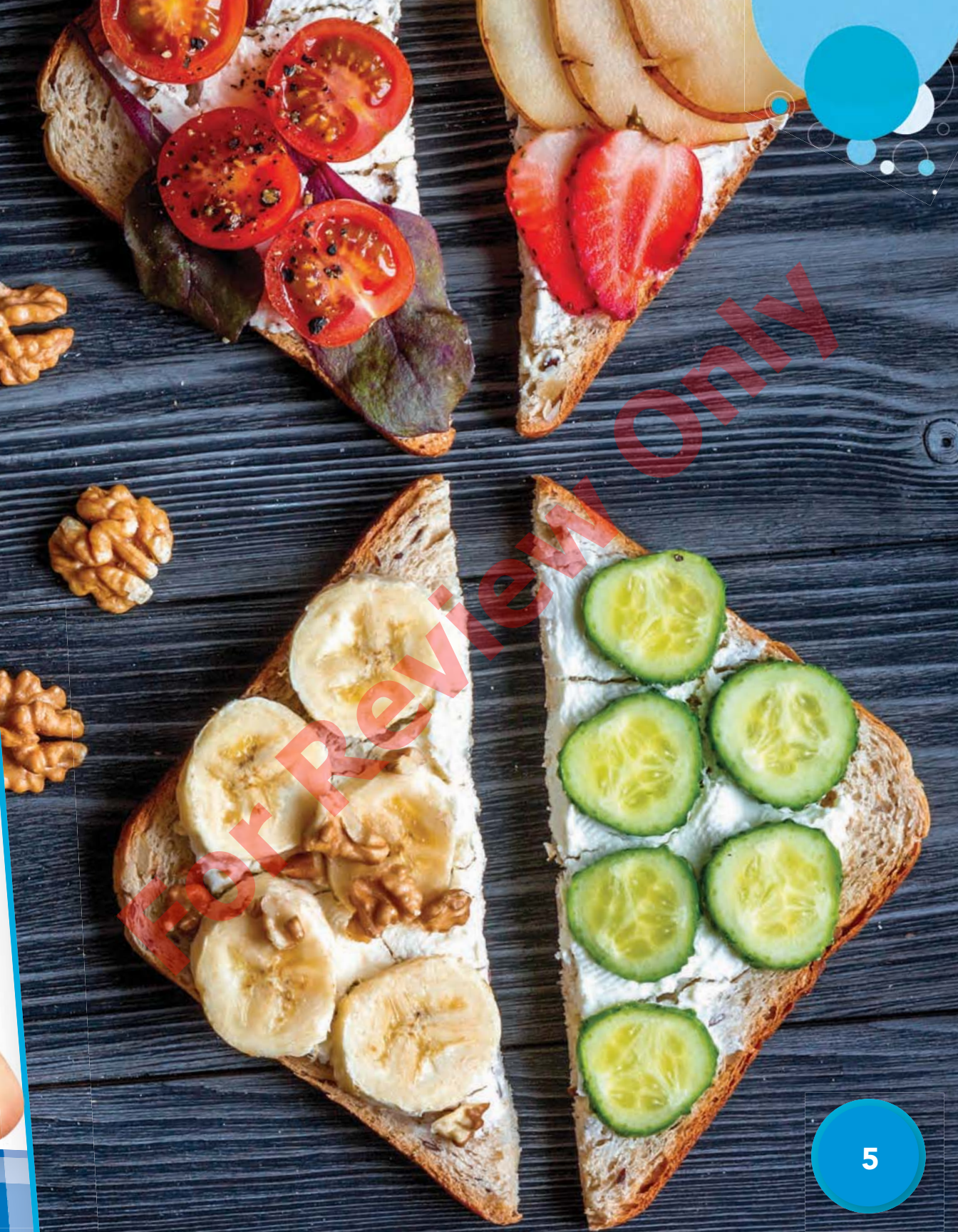

Start the Day with Shapes

You can see shapes at breakfast. What shape do you see?

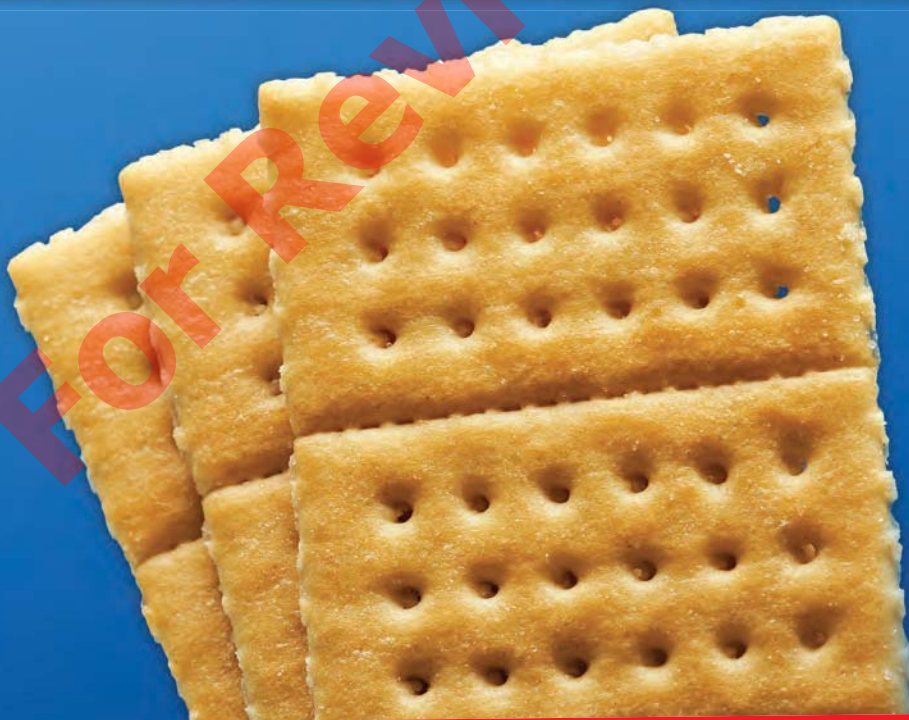
A **circle** is round and flat. A pancake is shaped like a circle. An orange slice is shaped like a circle, too.





Do you see **rectangles** at breakfast? A rectangle has four **sides** and four equal **angles**.
