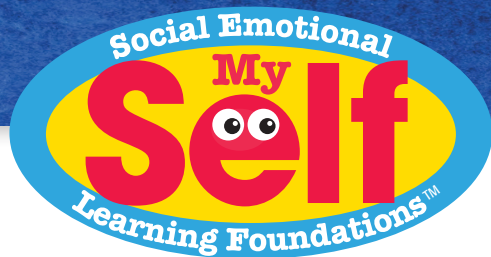


Let's Work Together

- Praise children's efforts to work with others toward a common goal.

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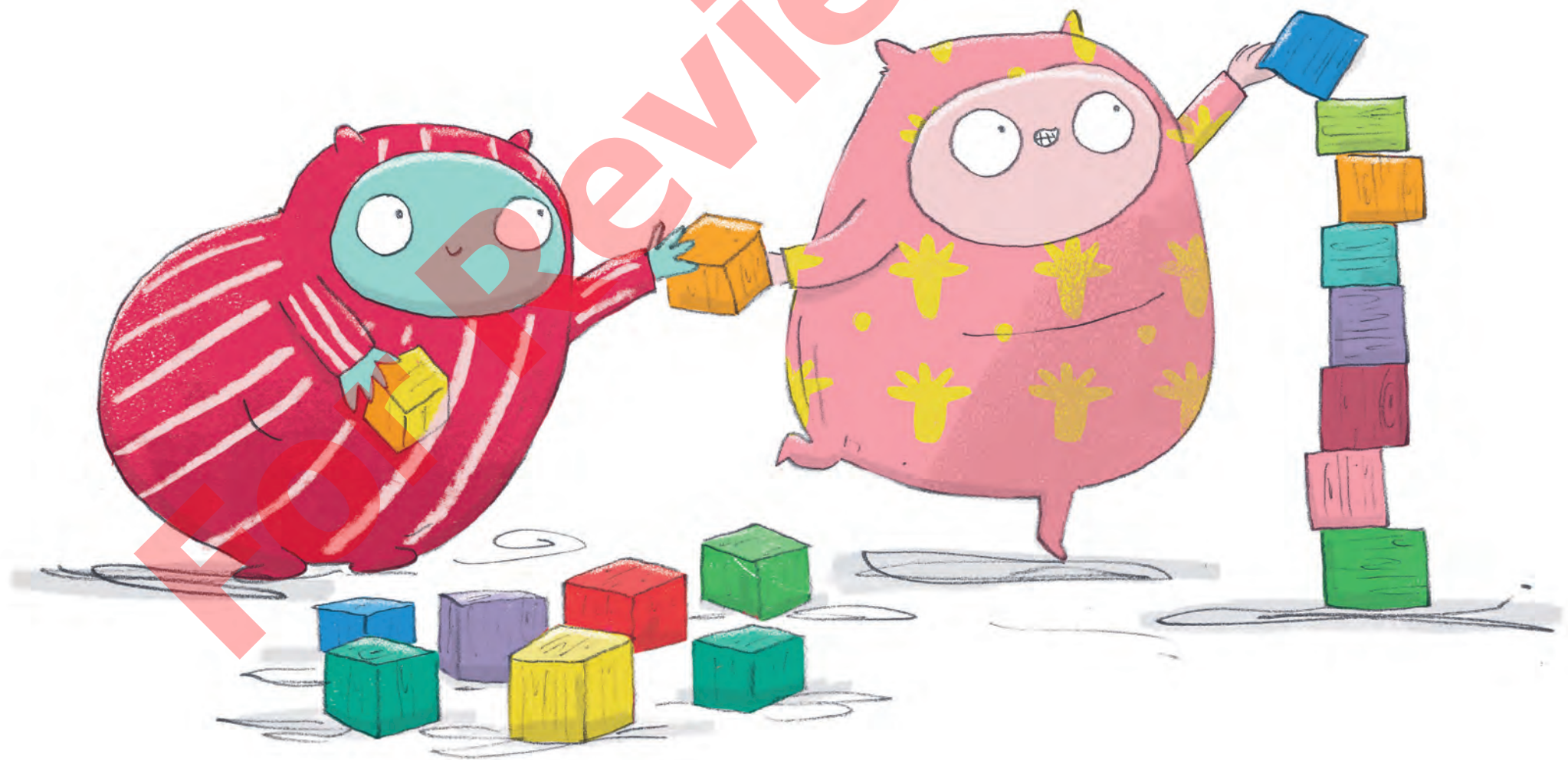
How to Read This Book with Children

- 1** Read aloud the title. Identify what it means to "work together."
- 2** Read aloud the book with children.
- 3** Ask children to describe how Sunny and Peanut find a way to work things out.
- 4** Talk about ways children can work well with others.
- 5** After reading, use the Real-World Wrap-Up prompts to discuss the photograph.
- 6** Guide children to connect the story to their own experiences.

Let's Work Together

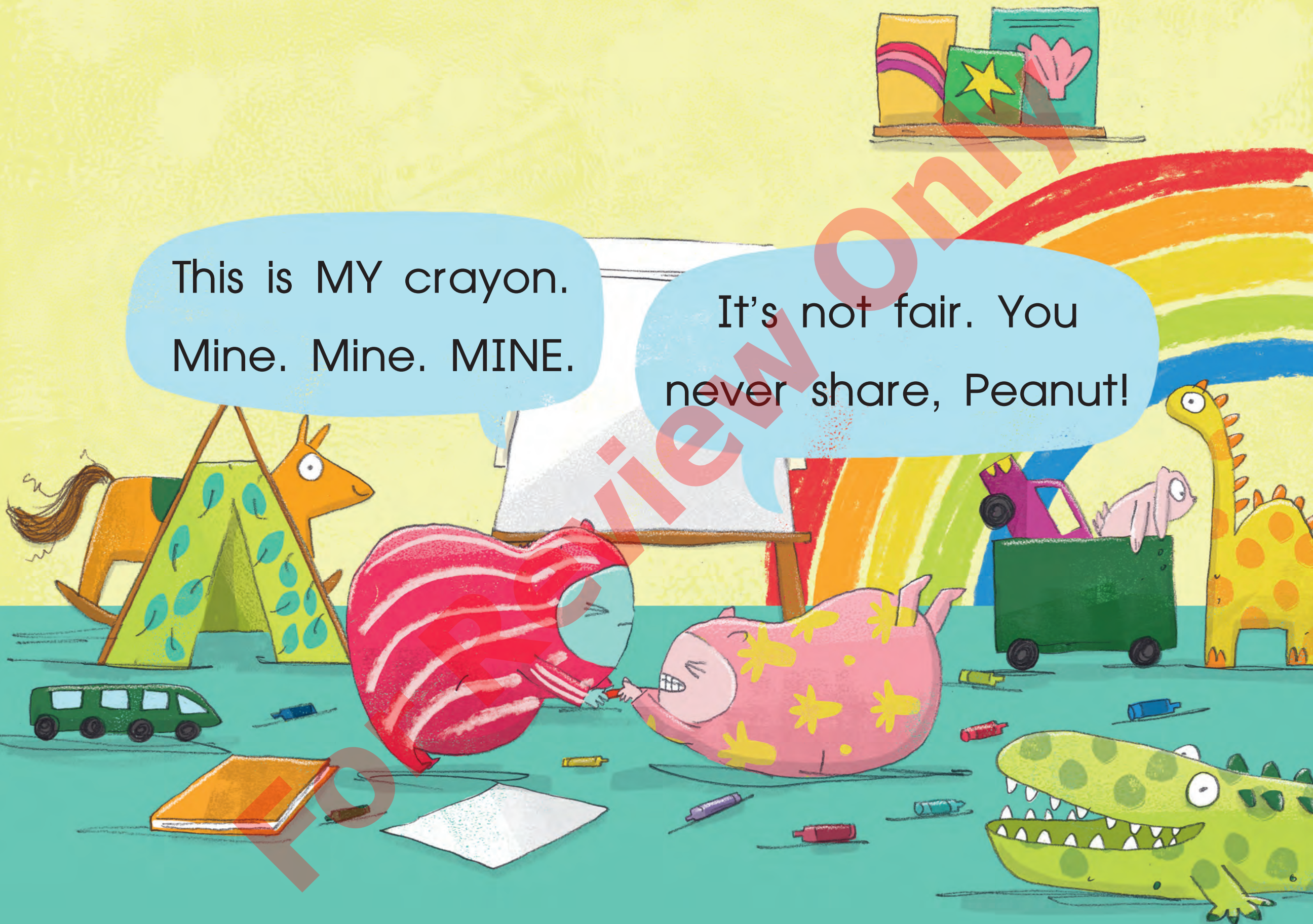
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This is MY crayon.
