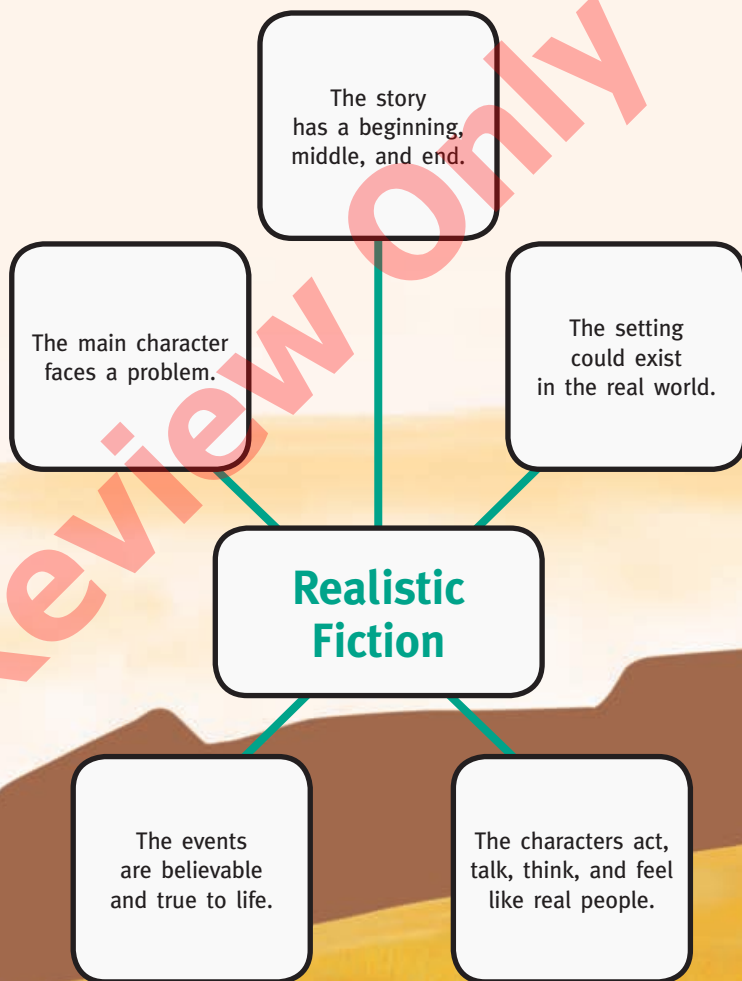


Paw Prints
