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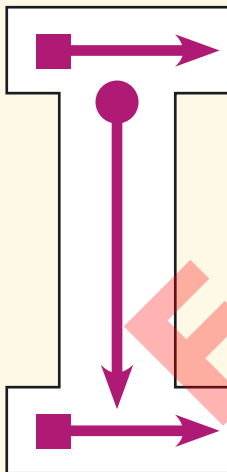
The Letter I

Tips for Reading 'Dog in a Dress'

- Practise the words listed above before reading the story.
- If the reader struggles with any of the other words, ask them to look for sounds they know in the word. Encourage them to sound out the words and help them read the words if necessary.
- After reading the story, ask the reader whether they remember which clothes each animal was wearing.
