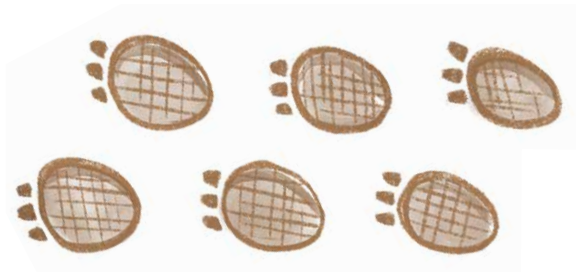

Danni looked in the garden shed for more costume ideas.

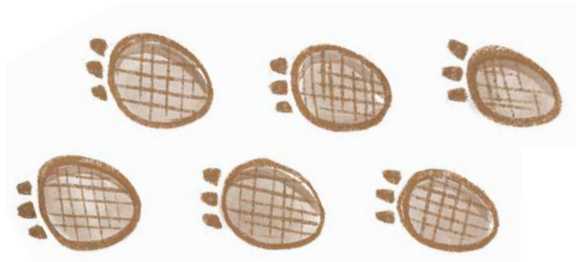
