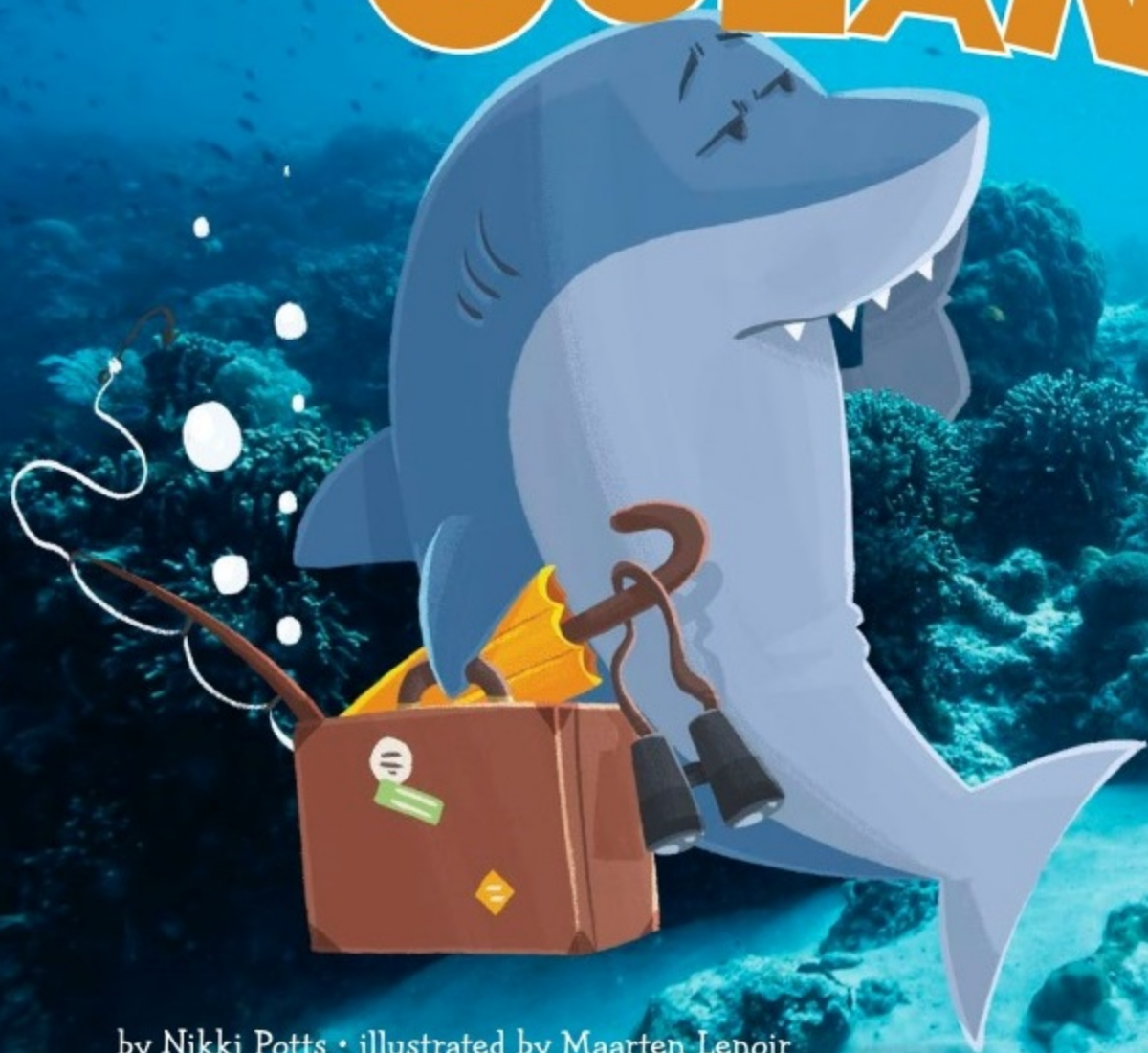


SHARK moves out of the OCEAN
