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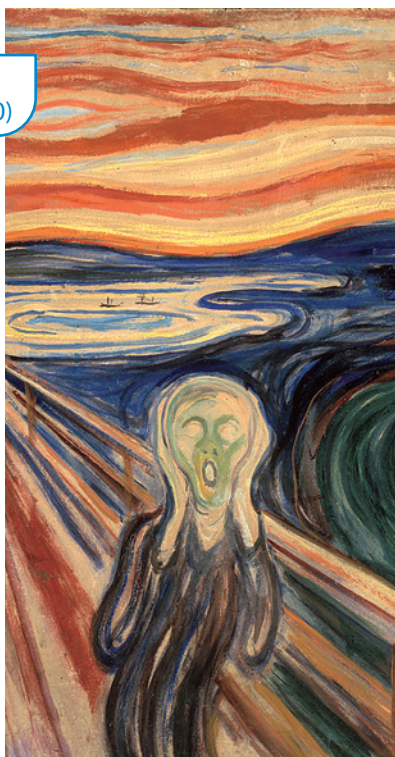
Introduction

Edvard Munch was a famous Norwegian painter. His paintings are known for their strong emotions and colors. If he sold one of his paintings, he would paint or draw it again. He often did many similar versions of the same painting or drawing!

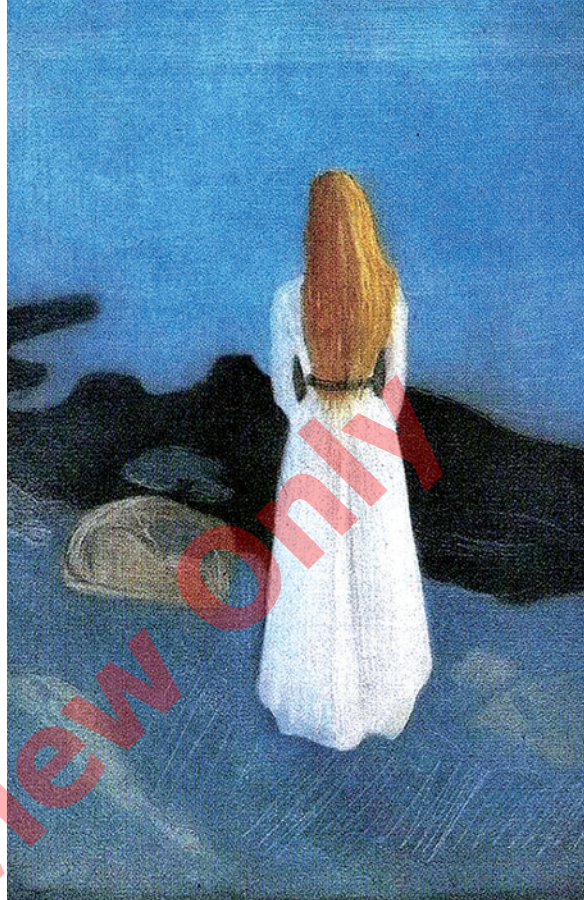
Munch painted many different types of themes. He painted about love and death. He painted about emotions like being jealous, too. An example of this is his painting, *Jealousy* from 1907.

Munch was famous for Symbolism. Symbols are objects or things that represent an idea or meaning. One example of this is *The Scream*. It represents the artist's emotions inside.
