“First I’m going to show you the kind of city that is making me sick,” says Earthy.

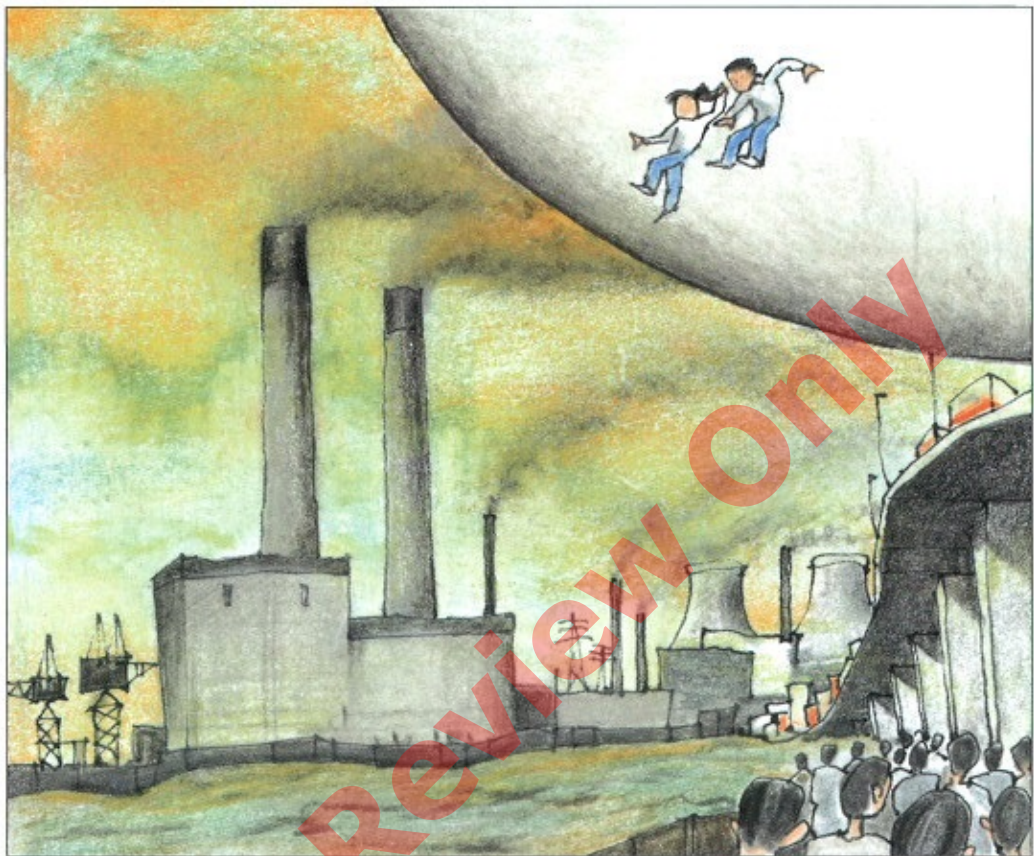
“Are you ill, Earthy?” asks Alice.
