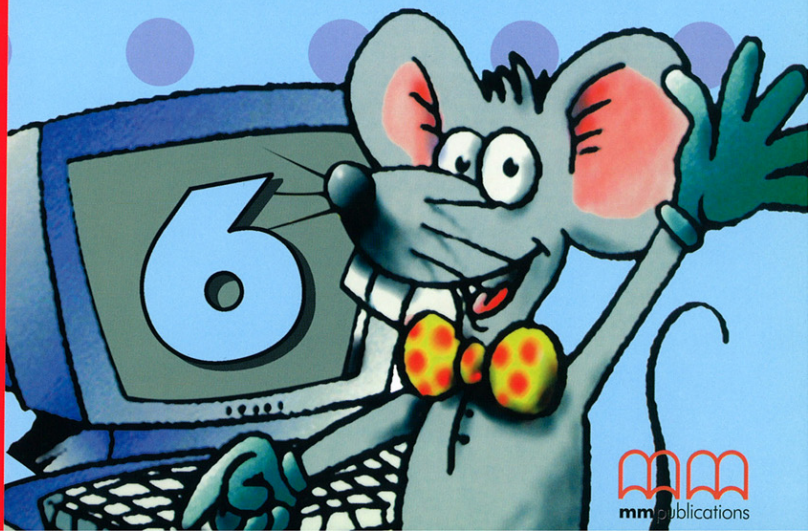

Present Progressive - Present Simple

Put the verbs in brackets into the **Present Progressive** or **Present Simple**.



Presenter: Tonight we are visiting (visit) Paradise Food Restaurant. It is (be) very famous. This is (be) the owner, Mr Tom Brown. Tell us about your famous restaurant.

Mr Brown: Yes. Our restaurant is famous because it always makes (make) tasty food. We open (open) every day at 6.30 p.m.. We never close (close) at weekends. Come and meet my workers.



Mr Brown: This is Harry. He is (be) a waiter. He isn't serving (not serve) now because he 's eating (eat) dinner.

Presenter: Does he always eat (eat) dinner here?

Mr Brown: Yes, my workers eat (eat) dinner here every evening.



Mr Brown: This is Brian and Fred. They wash (wash) the dishes in the kitchen. They aren't washing (not wash) now because there are no dishes.

Presenter: Ladies and gentlemen, you must come and visit this restaurant.



Present Progressive

We use the **Present Progressive** for actions that are happening at the **moment of speaking**:

Steve **is working** now.

I'm **drinking** coffee **at the moment**.

Present Simple

We use the **Present Simple** for **habits, repeated actions** and **permanent states**:

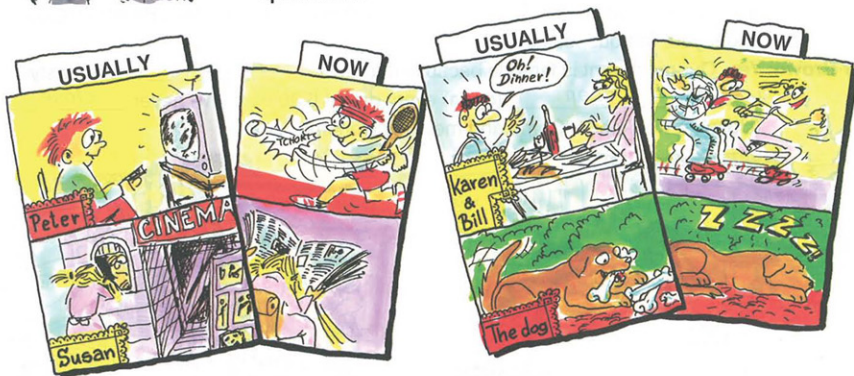
Steve works **every day**.

I **usually** drink milk.

He's eating. (eat)



5. What do actors do?

Actors act. (act)

What are these actors doing at the moment?

They're riding horses. (ride)
