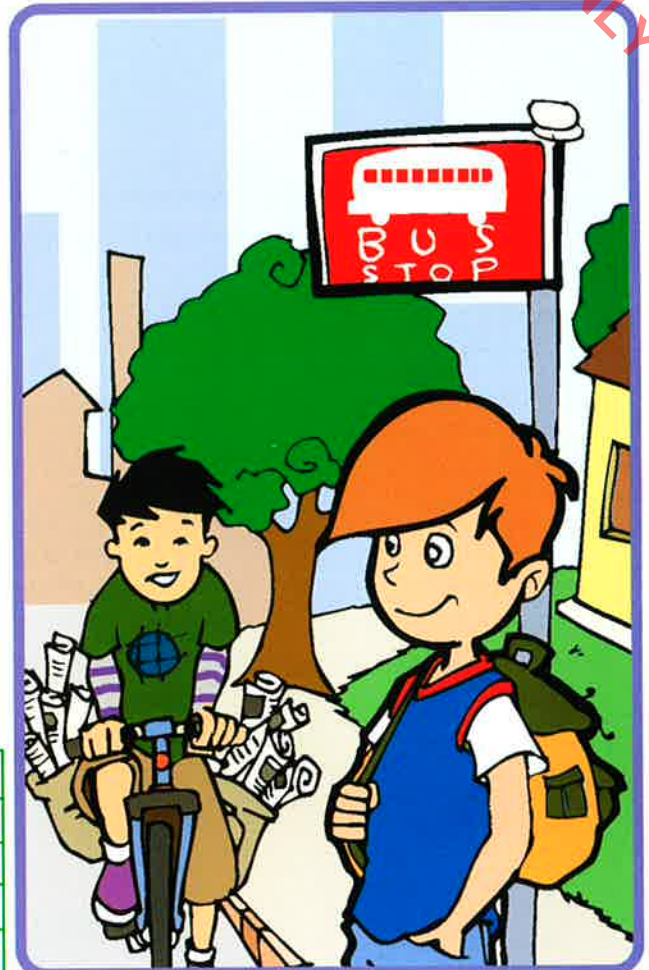

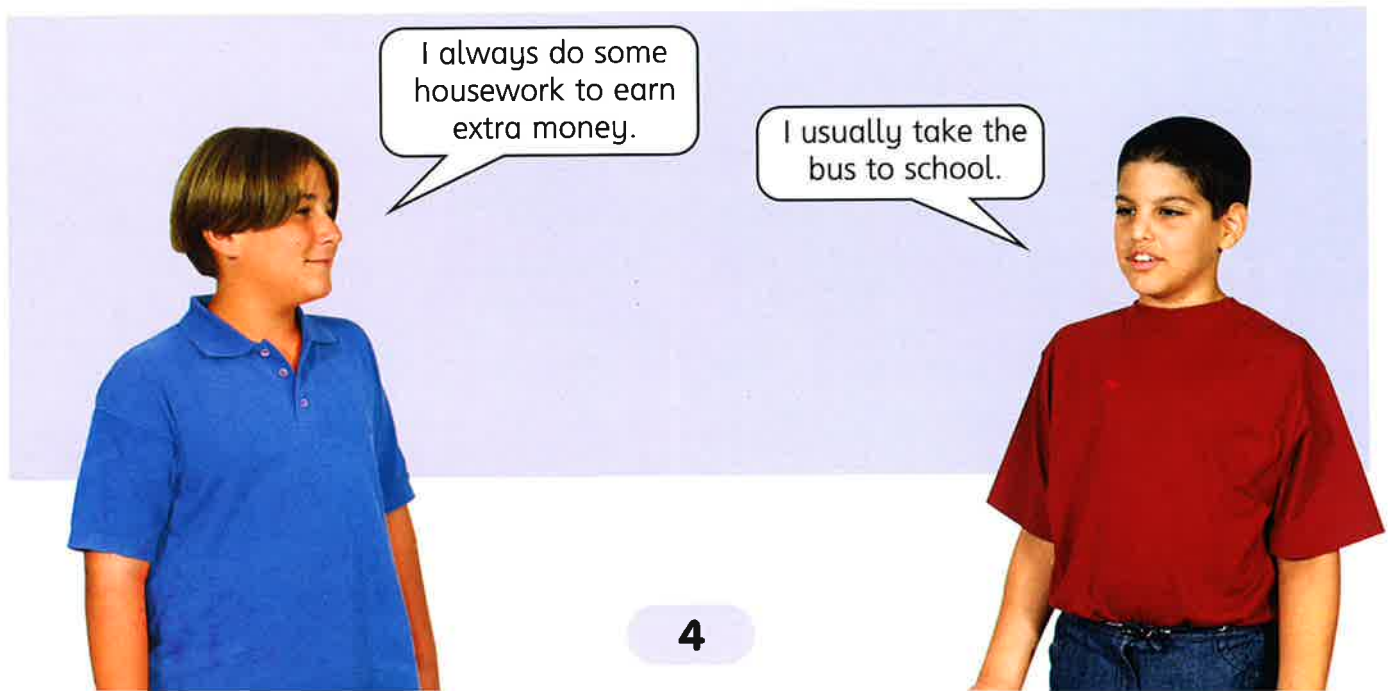

MONEY IN THE PAST

People use money all the time. However, in the past, people used stones, shells, tools, even salt and seeds to pay for things. For example, they paid for meat with a kilo of salt.

Coins are pieces of metal with a design on them. People first used coins in 700 BC in Lydia. The design on these coins was a lion's head. Coins quickly became popular in Europe and Asia.

Early coins were very interesting. In Rome, the first coins were square. In Olbia, a city near the Black Sea, most coins were round, but some were in the shape of a dolphin. The first Chinese coins were in the shapes of shells and tools. In Thailand, the first coins were rings.

The Chinese started using paper money in 1000 AD because their coins were very heavy. The first notes were very big. Some of them looked like newspapers!
